

If healthcare is about well-being, then why am I so stressed out?

Prior to coming to the University of Iowa Hospitals & Clinics 15 years ago, her professional career began as a pediatric staff nurse, then a clinical nurse specialist and later nursing faculty at Trinity Medical Center in Moline, IL. Dianne was hired at UIHC as the UI Health Plans Case Manager and later she expanded her role to become UI Personal Care Services, which provides individualized care coordination support to people with complex conditions needing assistance through transitions across the continuum of health care. When UI Health Care committed to participating in the first Accountable Care Organization with Medicare, Dianne was a natural fit to lead the ACO care coordination team and help create the infrastructure for population management with innovation and creativity. She received her Registered Nurse diploma from Lutheran Hospital School for Nurses, BSN from Marycrest College, and MSN from the University of Dubuque. Three ACOs later, Dianne is here to share her journey and some of the unique strategies that have led to UI Health Care's population health success. s an experienced I

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Trinity ACO – Lessons Learned from a Pioneer

Presenter: Lori Weih, UnityPoint

Lori Weih is the Regional Director – Cross Continuum Strategy for UnityPoint Health – Cedar Rapids. In this role she supports the region in furthering the necessary infrastructure and strategies for ideal care coordination and population health. Prior to her role in UnityPoint Health – Cedar Rapids, she worked for UnityPoint Health at the system level as part of the team in the initial development and implementation phases of the Accountable Care Organization. As part of this role, Lori supported the Trinity Pioneer ACO team in the Fort Dodge and surrounding region that began in January 2012. The Trinity Pioneer was selected in part by CMS to learn how care coordination and payment reform can be achieved in rural communities. Lori received her Master's Degree in Rehabilitation Counseling from the University of Iowa.
